This letter is in response to Attorney McKinley's August 22, 2025, letter submitted to the Court. (Dkt. 89). Attorney McKinley made strong accusations that the Association is lying without any attempt to confirm his false suspicions. Similarly, the Association denies the baseless accusation that the Association "intended solely to instigate animosity against FH Resort." This is a simple misunderstanding.

While it is true that Attorney McKinley did not appear on time for the August 21, 2025, hearing it is also true the court emailed the counsel of record at 8:40 am, before the 9:00 am hearing, advising that it would not be making a decision that day on the pending motion. Attorney McKinley's lack of presence until approximately 9:10 am led Cyndi Gierczak, the Association secretary, to believe that attorney McKinley caused the adjournment. This was simply a misunderstanding of the facts on her part. There were no evil motives, as Attorney McKinley attempts to attribute to her. Based on that misunderstanding, Ms. Gierczak sent the update. She did not realize the email from the court was time stamped before the hearing until Attorney McKinley sent his letter falsely accusing the Association of instigating animosity.

This case is about the Association correcting the decades of self-dealing between FHR and Manitowoc Timeshare Management company at the Association's unit owners' expense.
